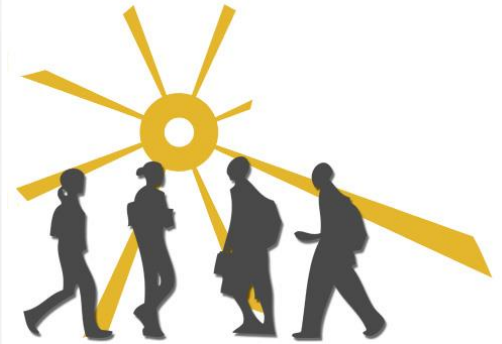

Summer School Policies

Course Offerings

SUMMER SCHOOL...

...is open to adults as well as high school students. Furthermore, some adults may wish to review a course or take a course they have not previously had in order to satisfy entrance requirements to schools of higher learning.

DISCIPLINE

Any student whose conduct is detrimental to the smooth operation of the summer school will be excluded from the program by the coordinator. The decision of the coordinator is final and there will be no appeal or refund of course fees.

BREAK POLICY

Each day, students will receive a 20-minute break. At that time, they may purchase snacks and drinks from the Coffee Café to be consumed in the Coffee Café at Haverhill High.

You may **NOT** leave school property at this time for any reason. This rule will be strictly enforced.

CLASS CREDIT

** Out of town students must get permission from their principal or guidance counselor prior to registration to take a course for credit. Such a written statements should be submitted to the summer school coordinator upon registration. Haverhill High School will forward the final grades to those schools. The question of course credit in every instance must be resolved by the student and his/her school administrator prior to registration in order to assure that credit be granted.

COURSE CHANGES

The coordinator of the summer school reserves the right to make any necessary change to assure the quality and consistency of the program. A course may be added if there is sufficient demand, or a course may be withdrawn due to insufficient registration.

ATTENDANCE

Good attendance is critical for students' success. We expect every student to strive toward perfect attendance. We do recognize, however, that illness and other circumstances beyond the control of any student may cause an absence and, therefore, allow up to two absences without penalty. These, however, should be used with great discretion.

ABSENCES

Due to the concentrated nature of all courses, at the time of the third absence, the student will be considered withdrawn from the course and no grade, credit, or refund will result. There are no exceptions to this rule.

Summer school classes begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. and runs until 11:30 a.m. Students are expected to be on time every day classes are in session. The total number of minutes that a student is tardy daily will be cumulative. For example, if you are tardy 20 minutes one day and tardy 30 minutes a second day, you will have 50 total minutes.

Once you reach the equivalent of THREE DAYS of school time (10.5 hours), you may be removed from Summer School and there will be no refund of course fees.

All courses are one credit unless otherwise noted.
